Ballots at Start of Day

- Keep provisional ballots at the Chief's station
- Do not confuse the two types of ballots

Use Provided Election Security Docs

- Provided at Chief pickup
- Allows you to focus on your job
- Encourage them to learn more about it
- Tell them your experience

Voter Registration

Maintaining registration data is an important component of election security. The registration process ensures all eligible citizens can register to vote while the maintenance program provides safeguards and procedures for removing ineligible voters to maintain accuracy.

Access to the Voter Database is Limited 🔒 🗳️

Access to the voter registration database is limited to specific employees given permission by the Virginia Department of Elections. All transactions are in a secure environment with 2-factor authentication.

Voter Maintenance is Constant ✅

The Voter rolls are routinely checked against Post Office records, court data, Bureau of Vital Statistics, and DMV information. Voters receive routine mailings to verify changes. Roughly 100,000 transactions and mailings each year add, update, and remove voters in compliance with state and federal laws.

Inactive Voters Have Limited Rights ✅

Voters who have mail returned to our office and do not respond to a follow-up mailing become "Inactive" voters. Inactive voters must complete a statement before voting and cannot vote by mail. They are automatically removed from the voter rolls for state and federal elections.

Pursuant to Executive Order 35 (August 7, 2024), the following provides information regarding election-related offenses and penalties under Virginia law:

It is a Class 6 felony to:

- Intentionally vote more than once in the same election, whether the additional votes are cast in Virginia or any other state or territory of the United States. § 24.2-1004(B)(i).
- Intentionally procure, assist, or induce another person to vote more than once in the same election, whether the additional votes are cast in Virginia or any other state or territory of the United States. § 24.2-1004(B)(ii).
- Intentionally vote where and when you know you are not qualified to vote. § 24.2-1004(B)(iii).
- Intentionally procure, assist, or induce another person to vote where and when you know they are not qualified to vote. § 24.2-1004(B)(iv).
- Intentionally register to vote at more than one residence address at the same time, whether the additional registrations are in Virginia or any other state or territory of the United States (does not apply if previous registration information is provided at the time of registering). § 24.2-1004(C)(i).
- Intentionally procure, assist, or induce another person to register to vote at more than one residence address at the same time, whether the additional registrations are in Virginia or any other state or territory of the United States (does not apply if previous registration information is provided at the time of registering). § 24.2-1004(C)(ii).

It is a Class 5 felony to:

- Willfully and intentionally hinder or prevent, or attempt to hinder or prevent, an election official or their employee from administering elections, including

Driver's Privilege Card

Driver's Privilege Card



Must have all 3:

1. Federal Limits Apply
2. AND "9" on Restrictions
3. AND "Limited Duration" on back



Driver's Privilege Card



“Federal Limits Apply” is not a Real ID, does not make it a DPC



Restrictions can be different #s

Without limited duration on back , “9” can be someone with a disability or medical condition

Driver's Privilege Card



Do not harass voters with a regular license

Offer voters with a DPC the option to present another ID or sign the ID Confirmation Statement

Use Affirmation of Eligibility if you have “knowledge, information, AND belief” a voter is not qualified (see Code Section 24.2-651)

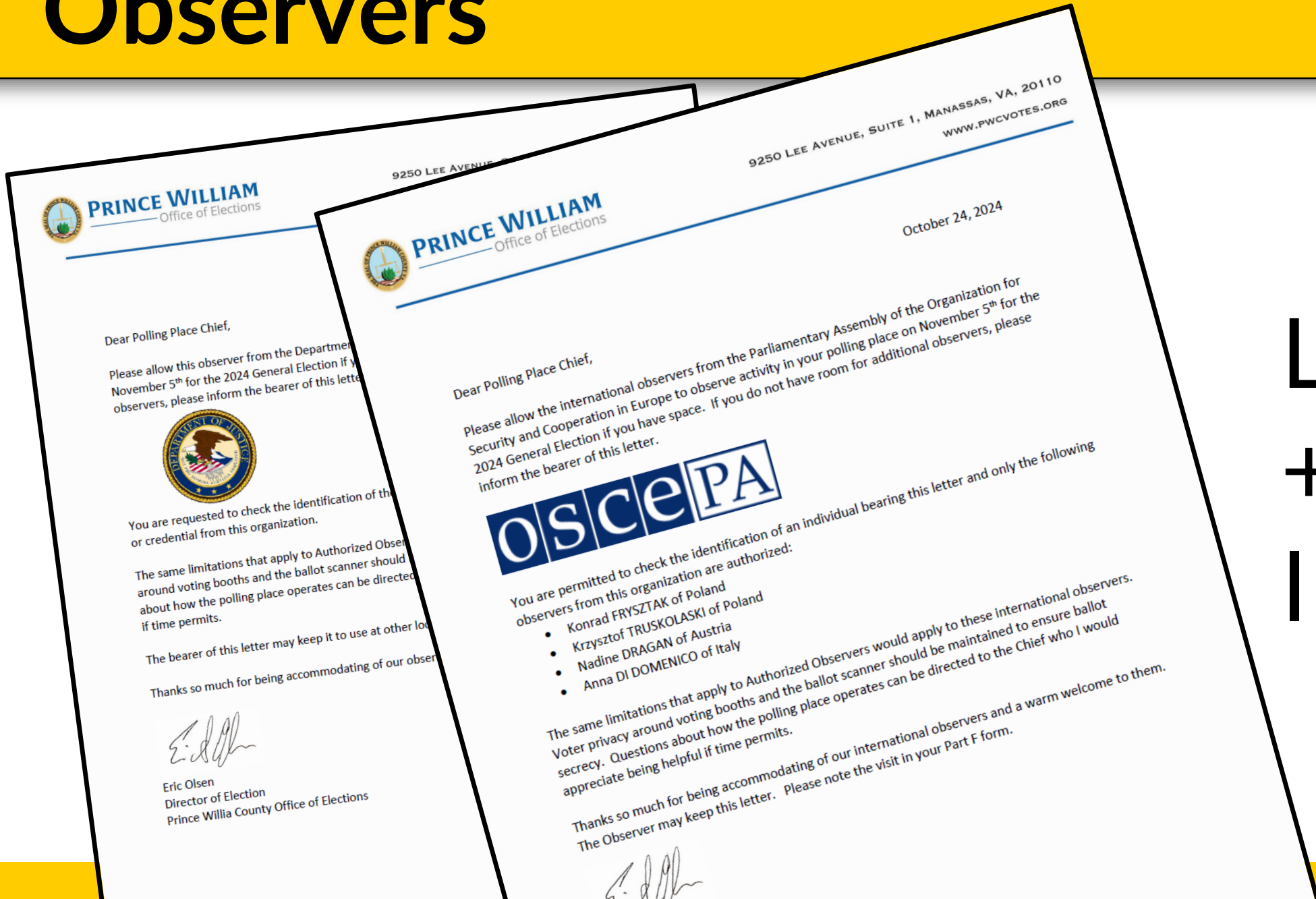


Types of Observers

Media Members

Media Members



Code Section § 24.2-604.5

- “Reasonable and limited duration” – about 15 minutes of filming should be enough
- No privacy/secretcy violations in filming
- Ask voters if filming is okay (“anyone object?”)
- Interviews must be outside the 40’ line

Media Members



Code Section § 24.2-604

- Applies to Observers and Media Members (a, c)
- Cannot “hinder or delay” a voter or officer
- Cannot “impede the orderly conduct of the election”
- (g) Vote out any person violating (a) or (c)
- They do not comply with this vote, call the police

Media Members



“Media Members”

- No requirement to identify themselves
- *If a media member refuses to identify himself or is being difficult, I recommend all officers refuse permission for the person to film and ask the person to go outside the 40' line*
- Persons giving permission to be filmed **INCLUDES** election officers

Closing Reminders



Before Closing

- Assign officers tasks prior to closing so they have something to do
- Remind them not to rush
- Remind officers you need to focus on results reporting and to give you time

Closing Reminders



Priority Tasks

- **Priority:** Close the ballot scanner(s), pollbook summary, and report results
 - Important so HQ can assist on tech issues
 - Add carefully if you have 2 scanners
 - Make sure to verify your results
