# Process





## Contest Rules

- Must be a PWC resident
- Must create your own artwork/design
- Design should reflect county identity



## Outreach to Generate Submissions

- Media coverage
- Reached out to school art programs
- Contacted graphic designers in the area



## Artist Entries

- 500+ contest entries
- Majority of entries from PWC students
- More entries than all Virginia sticker contests combined



## Narrowing It Down

- Review and reduce entries to 40 designs
- Staff/Board voted for 11 nominees
- Nominees refined designs for final voting

## Final Voting

- All election officers invited to vote
- 695 voted in total
- Rank-choice voting



## Rank-Choice Voting

- Voters ranked all stickers from #1 to #11
- Lowest ranked sticker each round is eliminated
- Votes from the eliminated sticker's next highest rank are distributed, repeat

# RECRUITMENT



- Office completed targeted mailing to 5,000+ primary voters
- Electoral Board asked 500+ active Republican officers to help recruit
- Reached out to 1,500+ NP officers
- County internal/public newsletters



# RETENTION

## Staffing Team Communication

- 83% rate the communication as “Excellent” with 97% positive ratings
- “Excellent” percentage has grown - 68%/71%/83% - the last three elections
- No staffing issues from March/June
- Outstanding work by Dena & Rick



# RETENTION

## Chief Evaluations

- 91% of officers rate their Chief as “Excellent”
- 92% of officers report they are “Very Likely” to work a future election

# APPOINT OFFICERS



- 353 total appointments today
  - 224 new election officer applicants
  - 129 election officers requesting to represent a party
- Requires Electoral Board appointment per VA Code §24.2-115

# TRAINING PLAN

- No significant law changes that impact the preparation of the election officers this year
- Updating training for new provisional envelopes, minor improvements to processes, reminders about procedure, and practice



# TRAINING PLAN

## Types of Training

- **All Officer Training** – Virtual or in-person
- **Leadership Certification Training** – In-person, 4-5 hours, hands-on experience
- **New Chief Orientation** – In-person training
- **New Officer Training** – In-person training
- **Director Meeting** – Virtual/recording



# SURVEY RESULTS

## Training Ratings – June Primary

- 59% rate the All Officer Training as “Excellent” with 97% positive ratings
- 67% rate the New Officer Training as “Excellent” with 95% positive ratings
- Scores have consistently improved
- Tommy and his team get high praise



# SURVEY RESULTS

## All Officer Training Engagement Responses

- Engaged – 80 people
- Satisfied – 57 people
- Bored – 5 people
- Overwhelmed – 3 people



# SURVEY RESULTS

## Leadership Certification Training

- 63% rate the course as “Excellent” with a 98% positivity rating
- 69% of new chiefs rate the New Chief Orientation course as “Excellent” with 100% positivity



# REAL-WORLD RESULTS

## June Primary Results Reporting

- 101 of 103 precincts reported their election results by 8:05 pm
- PWC was the first NoVA county to report all results at 8:15 pm
- All results from precincts 100% accurate

# NEW EARLY VOTING ORDINANCE\*

- 6 Early Voting locations for all elections
- Codifies the days open by election
- Electoral Board must define hours of operation for early voting sites

\*PWC Ordinance 24-17, 5/14/2024



# EARLY VOTING HOURS ORDINANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Must be compliant with VA Code 24.2-701(B) – 8 hours on Saturdays
- Satellites must be open 6 hours
- Satellite locations must have identical hours on days open

# VOTER GUIDE



- Going to all PWC households by mid-September
- Provides information on new early voting locations, dates, and hours
- Will provide other helpful information to voters including voting requirements, election security, voting by mail, etc.



# INCREASING CAPACITY

- Early Voting locations are expanding pollbooks and voting booths at our busiest locations – DMV, Haymarket, Main Office, and Ferlazzo
- Capacity for 140,000+ voters with a wait of less than 15 minutes

# EARLY VOTING HOURS



- Requires Electoral Board action to set the election early voting hours per PWC Ordinance No. 24-17

# BALLOT ORDER





# PROJECTION PLANNING

Preparing for turnout in the 75-85% range

- Planning for surge in registrations
- Preparing for 100,000+ early/mail voters  
and 150,000+ Election Day voters



# BALLOT ORDER

Total order of 264,400 ballots for Election Day

- Roughly 2,500 ballots per precinct
- Would cover ballot needs even if every voter showed on Election Day
- Will order 200-300 additional provisional ballots per precinct (20,000+ ballots)

# BALLOT ORDER



- Requires Electoral Board to approve an adequate number of ballots to conduct the election under VA Code §24.2-612

# STAFFING HIGHLIGHTS

- Total of more than 1,050 officers
- 9-12 officers at each precinct
- Chief, Assistant Chief, and EPS - 3 certified leadership officers at each location
- Extra officers to rotate breaks








