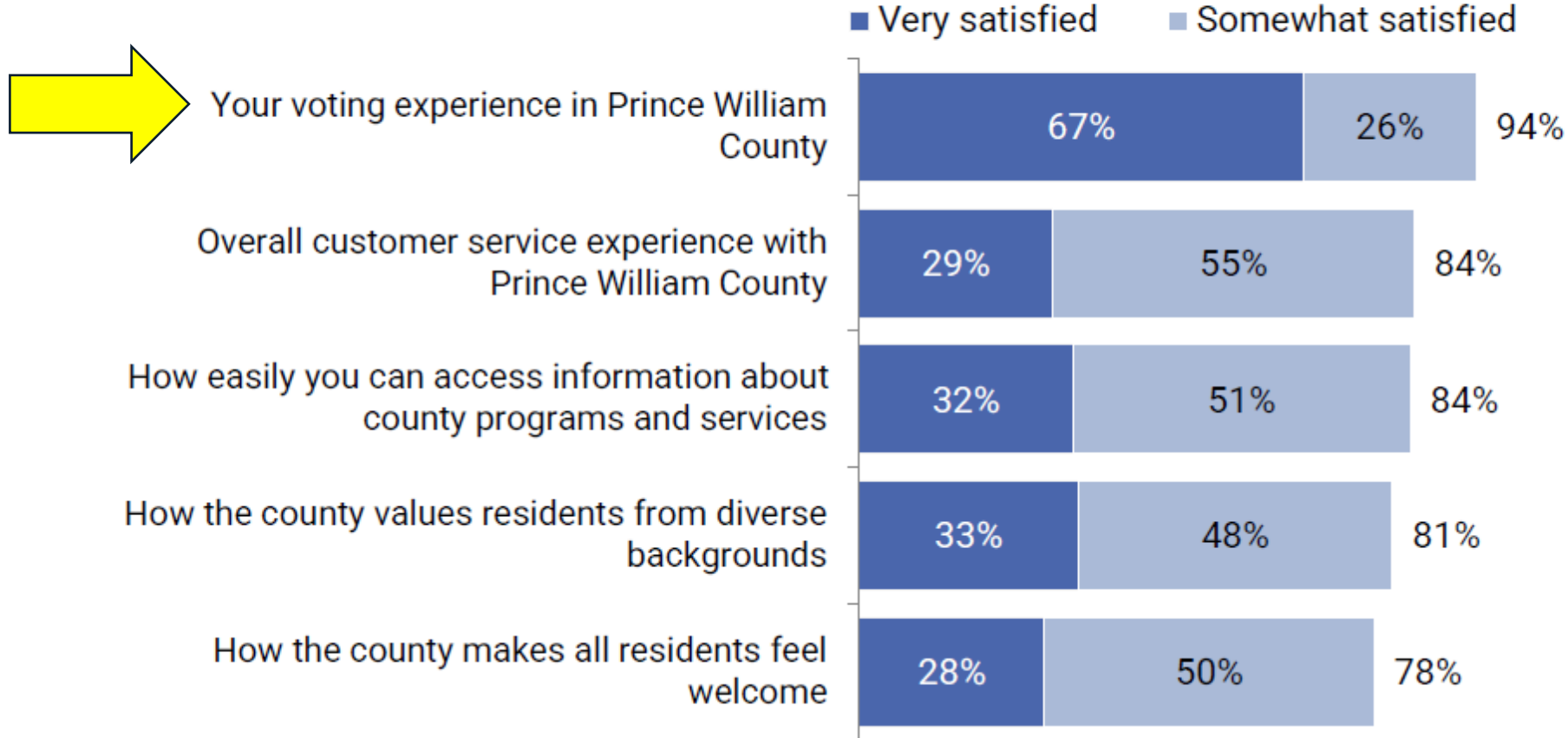

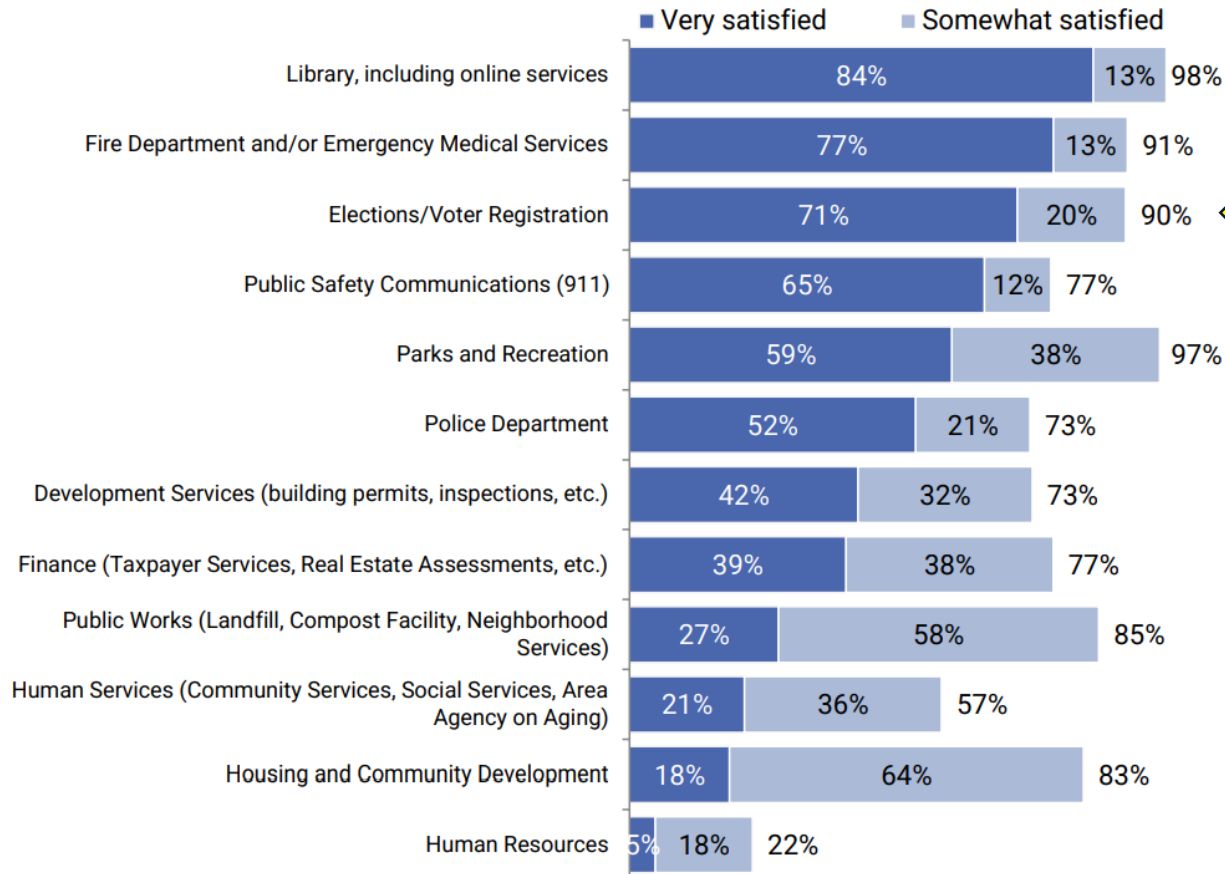

"CLEARIE" AWARDS

Summary: Transparency = Confidence

Prince William County was the first county in Virginia and one of the first in the nation to publish all officer-signed results tapes online, giving the public access to primary sources of election results.

In recent years, concerns about election integrity have been voiced regarding the accuracy of results, effectiveness of voting machines, etc. The most effective way to combat disinformation and concerns at the local level is to provide heightened levels of transparency that allows the public access in new and unprecedented ways.

This has two significant impacts – (1) it builds confidence by allowing skeptics to access the source of concern and (2) the act of supplying public access to such data/documentation builds confidence even if never acted upon.

While the public having the ability to verify a particular precinct's results match the reported totals is valuable as a validation test, the confidence gained in the knowledge it is available is just as meaningful, if not more so.

Phase 1 Advertisement

We had to ensure that our contest had clear guidelines. It was imperative that our winner be someone who was a resident of Prince William County. Based on research we'd done on other "I Voted" sticker design contests from around the country, we also noticed a trend that winning designs were bold and vibrant, and featured subjects that were specific to the locality in which they were to be used. Red, white and blue is great, but we wanted a design that would emphasize that voting is a local process.

To aid entrants in their designs, we included a list of tips and inspiration that re-emphasized our desire to see bold color and county-centric designs. This did not completely stop us from receiving a good number of eagles and American flag designs, but it did help.

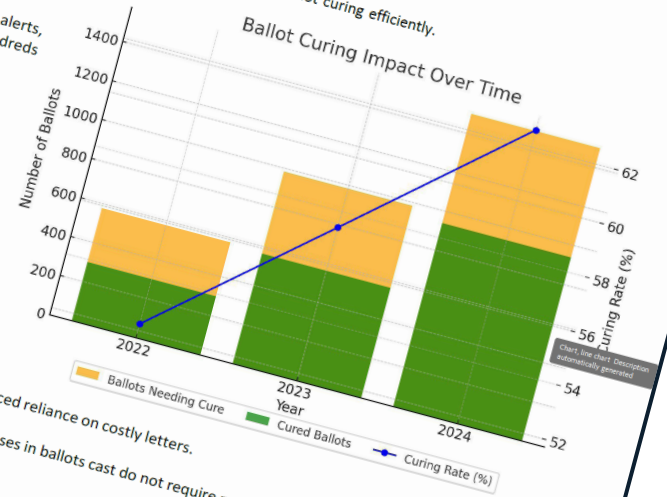

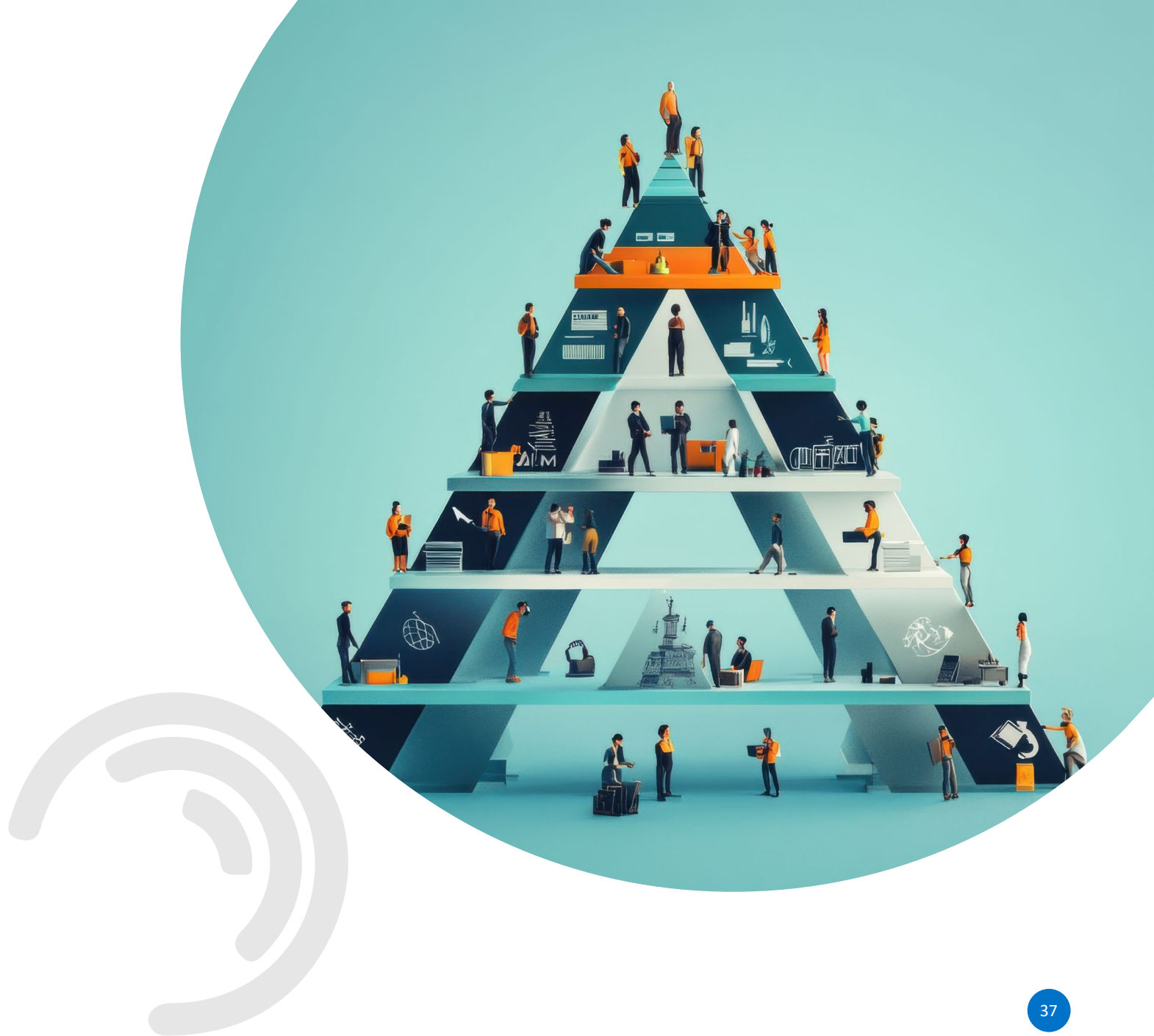

EARLY VOTING DAYS



Per BOCS Ordinance:

“For all primary and special elections, satellite offices will open on the Saturday ten(10) days prior to Election Day for all days through the Saturday prior to Election Day;”

Satellites must have same hours, open 6+ hours

EARLY VOTING DAYS



Virginia Code: Early voting will start at the Office on Friday, May 2nd

Ordinance: Early voting satellite locations will be open for 8 straight days from Saturday, June 7 to Saturday, June 14



EARLY VOTING HOURS

Hours set by the **Electoral Board**, past hours:

- 8:30 am – 4:30 pm Weekdays
- 8:30 am – 7:00 pm (Wed only)
- 8:30 am – 5:00* pm Saturdays (2)
